---

- Review ongoing monitoring to make recommendations

# Guiding Principles

---

- Every effort should be made to ensure participation of stakeholder groups
- The process will encourage participation by stakeholders
- Focus on producing outcomes as identified within the EA
- Include monitoring components
- Projects will honor the complexity of forest ecosystems and use the best available science for their implementation
- Projects will focus on creating and maintaining healthy forests ecosystems and consider the community's economic needs and impacts to local landowners and businesses

## Annual Rhythm at a Glance

- **Meeting cadence:** 4 meetings (Quarterly), including 1 field day aligned with treatment/monitoring windows.
- **Decision style:** Consensus (decisions all can support or agree to live with); use Operations Manual protocols for notice, conduct, and proxies/alternates
- **Key waypoints:** Project review + Monitoring → Comment Period → Post-treatment field review → Annual report/next-year recommendations.
